Popcorn results are in!

Congratulations Cub Scouts! We did even better selling popcorn this year than we did last year ... and with fewer Scouts, too!

- We made a total of \$8,263 between site, individual "take" and Internet sales. Of that amount, our Pack should receive 40% — almost \$3,500 — to help fund our annual program. Additionally, we picked up \$513.24 in donations. The first \$180 of a Cub's sales go to their

Pack dues (the amount the Pack receives on the first \$180 works out to the \$60 the Pack charges in dues each year). But beyond that amount, Cubs will receive 10% of their total sales in the form of Pack Bucks that can be spent on Scouting events and merchandise.

- Thank you to our Cubs (and to their parents) for the work put into our annual fundraiser. Also, a special "Thank

You" to Debbie Racey, our Popcorn Kernel, for her work on this important project.

- Popcorn will be available for pick-up over the weekend of Nov. 9-11. We ask that popcorn be delivered and final payments be collected by our November Pack meeting on the 27th. We must close out all sales by the end of the month. Questions? Please direct them to Debbie.

It's time for Recharter

In order to remain Scouts each year, there are two sets of dues that must be paid. The dues that are owed to the Pack — that help us put on a program throughout the year — can either be paid directly or earned by selling popcorn. These dues will be tallied after all popcorn is finalized. But the dues that are

owed to the Boy Scouts of America are a separate issue. Each year, each Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Venture Scout and Explorer must pay a relatively small amount to the national BSA in order to continue as registered Scouts. If you are able tonight, please see our Treasurer, Laura Loup, to pay your

son's recharter fees: \$15 per boy to recharter or \$27 if he would also like to subscribe to Boy's Life magazine. If not, please arrange to pay these dues to your Den Leader within the next two weeks. (Recharter is due to the council at the Nov. 8 Roundtable meeting.) Thank you all for your attention to this matter.

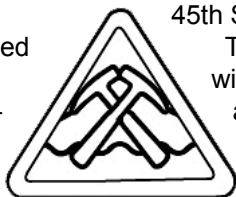
Can you dig it?

The Burke Museum is located on



the University of Washington campus at the corner of 17th Avenue and NE 45th Street in Seattle.

The program is \$15 per Scout, with an accompanying adult admitted free.

More About Camp
